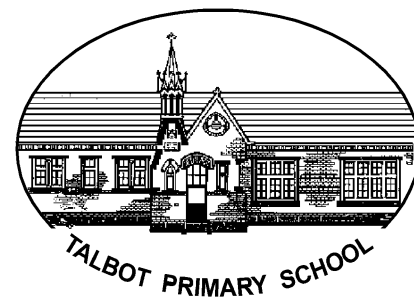

A message from the Acting Principal

Dear Parents and Friends,

Illness – Please be aware that we still have many cases of Covid, flu and gastro in the community. Whilst we love and want all students to have strong attendance, we cannot have them at school if they are unwell. If children develop symptoms at school, we will contact you to collect them. We understand that this can be difficult due to work and care commitments, and we thank the community for the support we have received at this difficult time.

Camp – We are looking forward to the grade 3-6 camp which will take place from Monday 20th June to Tuesday 22nd June inclusive. The program for the Creswick Log Cabin Camp looks really exciting! Please ensure notes are returned as soon as possible. There is no cost for this camp.

Preparation for Puberty – Students in grades 5-6 participated in three workshops delivered by Caslemaine Health this week, with another workshop scheduled for Wednesday and then another later in the year. This program helps children prepare for the transition to puberty by talking about the physical, social, and emotional changes that commonly occur at this time.

We have been seen again



Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures. They have survived living solely on human heads for 10 000 years. You may be reassured to know that they are commonly found in places other than Talbot P.S.

Some of the reasons they have survived for as long as they have are:

- The six legs of a louse end in a claw, allowing them to grip the hair.
- They detect vibration and can hide - (conditioner will help fix this problem)
- Head lice can 'hold' their breath for 20 mins – looking like they are dead.
- The eggs are attached to the hair with a 'glue' like substance. Studies conducted on 45 different products to dissolve the 'glue' showed **nothing** would dissolve it.

The good news...

We know where they live and we know how to find them.

If you follow these steps, once a week, the control of head lice in your home will be greatly improved.

Step 1 Comb inexpensive hair conditioner in to **dry, brushed (detangled) hair**. This makes it difficult for lice to grip the hair or run around;

Step 2 Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue;

Step 3 Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs;

Step 4 If lice or eggs are found, the child should be treated with a commercial headlice treatment;

Step 5 If the child has been treated recently and only hatched eggs are found, you may not have to treat since the eggs could be from the old infection. If the eggs are "live" they will appear a brown/ clear colour and if you run your fingers over them they will stick to the hair shaft. If the eggs are 'old' they appear white and will come off easily when you try to remove from the hair shaft.

Please note, it is imperative to remain vigilant in checking your children's hair and removing **ALL** live eggs. If the eggs aren't all removed reinfestation may occur.

If your child has head lice – tell anyone who has had head to head contact with them, ask them to check their family for head lice and notify the school.

It is school policy (and that of the Department of Health) that if live lice are found on your child at school, they must be taken home to be treated and returned only after this process has commenced.

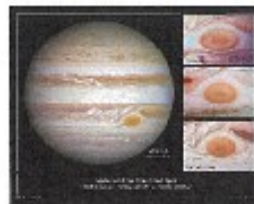
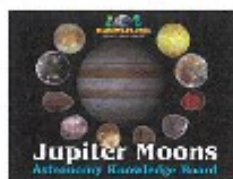
Jupiter by Larni

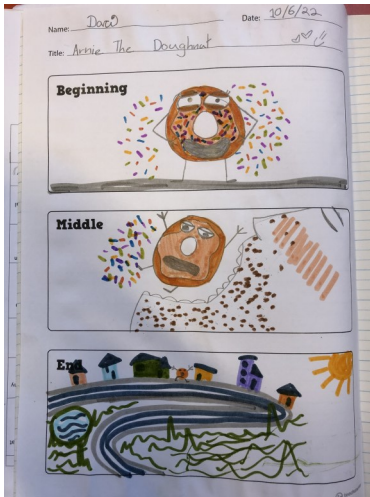
NEPTUNE

- Neptune is the most distant planet in the world.

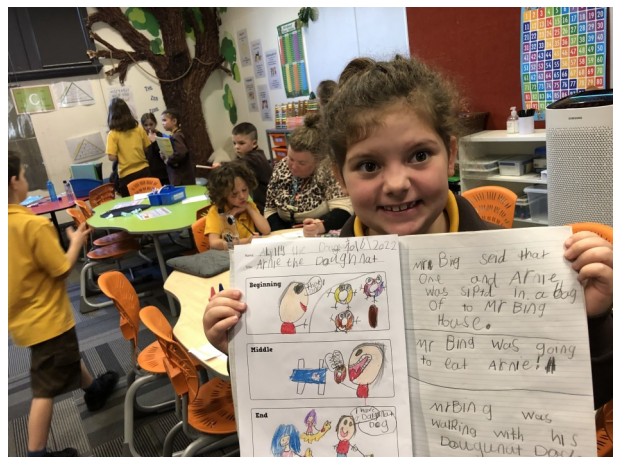
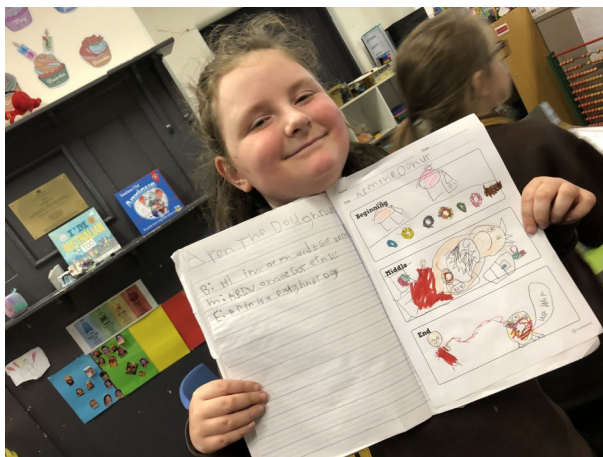


- Neptune is the smallest gas giant.
