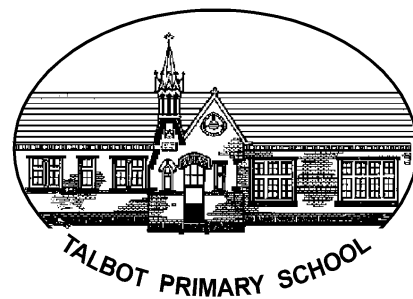

Learning Conferences

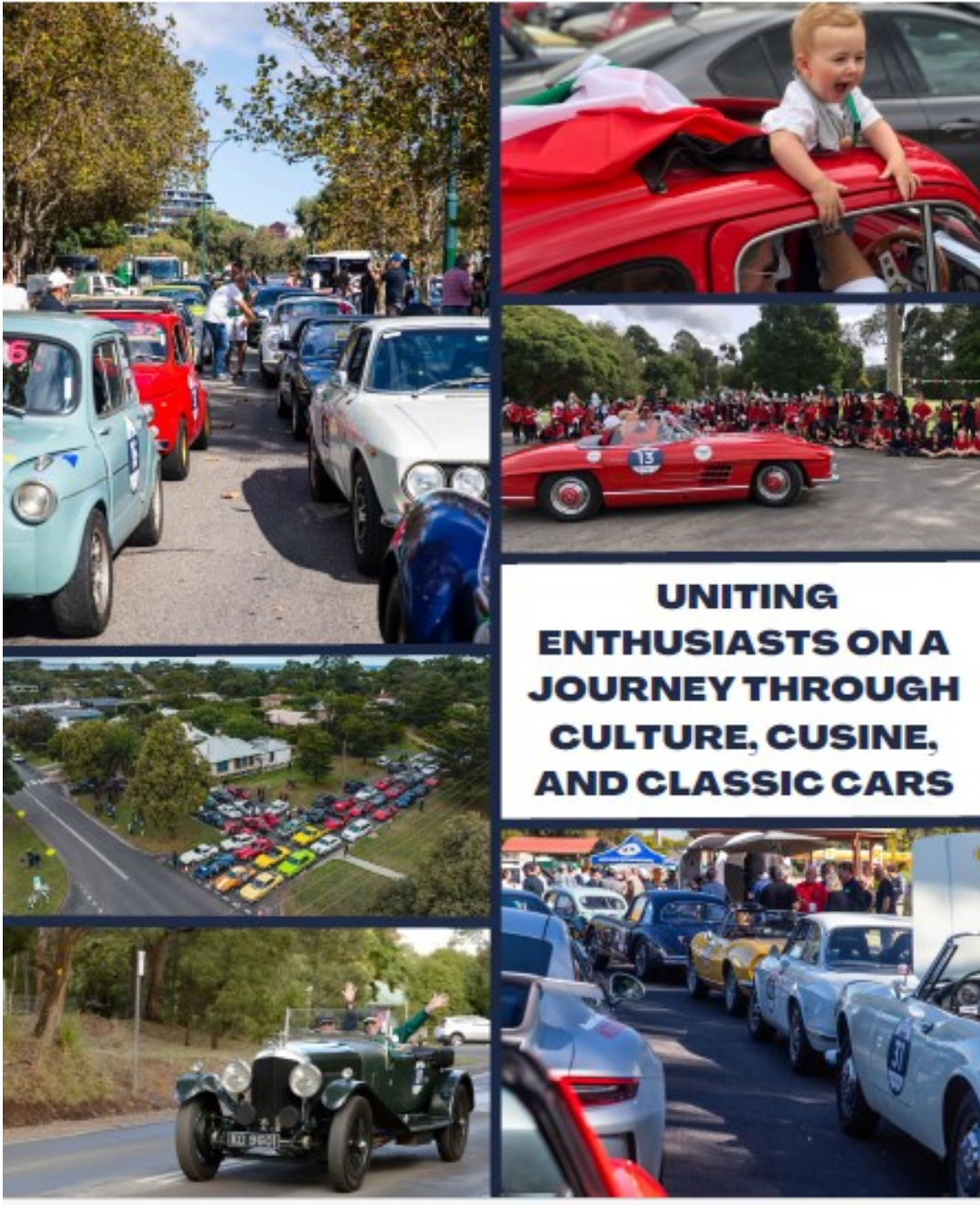
