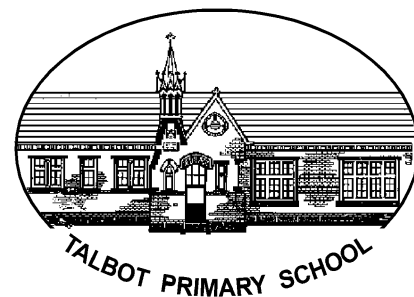

A message from the Acting Principal



Dear School Community,

COVID 19 Update – This week we can report three new positive COVID 19 cases within the student population, and several related cases in the community. Masks are available from the office for those who wish to use them and RATs are also available upon request.

Curriculum Day – Thank you for supporting the school curriculum day. Gary Perrott from the Regional Office led the teaching team through the 6 Traits of Writing, a new framework for writing instruction that will be introduced into classrooms over the semester. Gary will return later in the year to work 1:1 with teachers in their classrooms with students.

3 Way Conferences – Thank you to families for coming in to participate in catch ups with teachers on Tuesday. Please remember that teachers are happy to chat to you about your child's progress throughout the term.

Athletics – Thank you to all of those students who have returned their notes for the Dunolly Cluster Athletics Carnival, which will be held on Friday 5th August. We will be talking with students about the range of events over the coming week. Whilst most activities will be compulsory, please note that hurdles and high jump are not. This looks like a fun day out and I'm looking forward to leading the 11 years girls group on the day.

Book Week – Talbot PS Book Week dress up day will be held on Wednesday 24th August. The theme for Book Week this year is 'Dreaming with eyes wide open'. Look out for more information in upcoming newsletters.

In our classrooms – It has been wonderful to check in with students to see what has been going on in our classrooms this week:

Eddie (prep) – This week I learnt you can get news from different places. You can get news from the TV, radio and the internet.

Riley P (grade 1) – I like Maths. We played BOB. We use the counting chart in the Book Nook to go down from 20.

Lee-Ann (grade 2) – I like Maths because it is my favourite activity. I have done some numbers and counting. We also played Buzz. In Buzz, we go in a circle and we count by 1s. If someone says 10 instead of 'buzz' they are out.

Mila (grade 3) – This week we have been learning about similes in poetry. A simile is where you are comparing something, like 'I jumped up like a rocket ship!'

Kii (grade 4) – I am proud of my writing that I did. I wrote about whales. I found out that the black and white whales are called killer whales. At school I did a poem about people and friends. We did similes, like 'Chevy my friend is as special as gold.'

Lachlan (grade 5) – We are doing BODMAS. It makes doing equations easier. You go through the order: brackets, order, division, multiplication, addition and subtraction. It helps me do hard sums.

Tess (grade 6) – When we did BODMAS, Mrs Mac had an exit ticket which was 15 to the power of 2. When I went to Mrs Mac, she said it was wrong. Then I went back and had another go and I got it right and it made me really proud.

We have been seen again



Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures. They have survived living solely on human heads for 10 000 years. You may be reassured to know that they are commonly found in places other than Talbot P.S.

Some of the reasons they have survived for as long as they have are:

- The six legs of a louse end in a claw, allowing them to grip the hair.
- They detect vibration and can hide - (conditioner will help fix this problem)
- Head lice can 'hold' their breath for 20 mins – looking like they are dead.
- The eggs are attached to the hair with a 'glue' like substance. Studies conducted on 45 different products to dissolve the 'glue' showed **nothing** would dissolve it.

The good news...

We know where they live and we know how to find them.

If you follow these steps, once a week, the control of head lice in your home will be greatly improved.

Step 1 Comb inexpensive hair conditioner in to **dry, brushed (detangled) hair**. This makes it difficult for lice to grip the hair or run around;

Step 2 Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue;

Step 3 Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs;

Step 4 If lice or eggs are found, the child should be treated with a commercial headlice treatment;

Step 5 If the child has been treated recently and only hatched eggs are found, you may not have to treat since the eggs could be from the old infection. If the eggs are "live" they will appear a brown/clear colour and if you run your fingers over them they will stick to the hair shaft. If the eggs are 'old' they appear white and will come off easily when you try to remove from the hair shaft.

Please note, it is imperative to remain vigilant in checking your children's hair and removing **ALL** live eggs. If the eggs aren't all removed reinfestation may occur.

If your child has head lice – tell anyone who has had head to head contact with them, ask them to check their family for head lice and notify the school.

It is school policy (and that of the Department of Health) that if live lice are found on your child at school, they must be taken home to be treated and returned only after this process has commenced.
