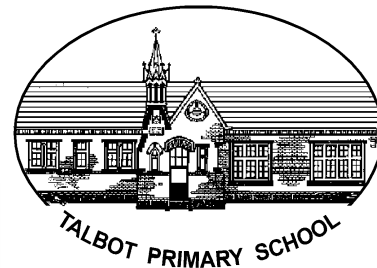

Talbot Primary School is very aware of the Victorian Child Safe Standards and will always let our community know when policies are being updated so that questions or concerns can be raised.

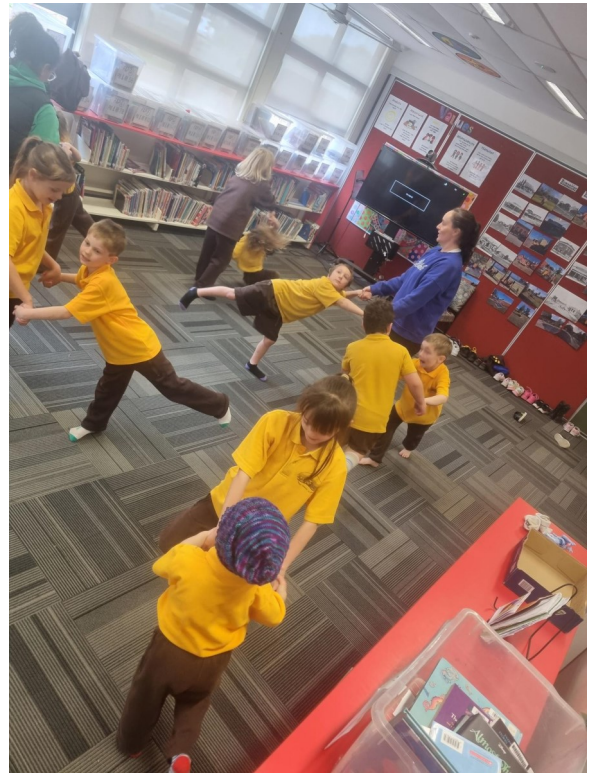
Please feel welcome to talk to members of our School Council about the recent training session, or visit the office if you would like a paper copy of our policies. They are readily available for reading on our school website at all times.

WEEK 1

ANIMAL ANATOMY DRAWING

Monday September 23, 10 am - 3 pm

• **Objective:** Learn to draw the anatomy of a variety of animals. Students are encouraged to bring pictures of their pets or favourite critters!

• **Activities:**
Introduction to anatomy drawing techniques.

Draw animals like wolves, tigers, cats, narwhals and more.

We will look at symmetry, proportion and facial features.

Students will have the opportunity to use a variety of drawing mediums.



FASHION FUSION Art Inspired Wearable Masterpieces

Thursday September 26, 10 am - 3 pm

• **Objective:** Learn about the intersection of fashion design and art by creating your own fashion inspired by famous paintings using mixed media techniques.

• **Activities:**
Students select a famous painting and reinterpret it into a wearable art design using collage techniques, markers and mixed media.

Students will be shown examples of how art has influenced fashion throughout history.

Design and assemble and add details and embellishments to enhance their designs.

Once everyone has completed their fashion pieces, the class will conclude with a mini runway show.



WEEK 2

PAPER INSECT SCULPTURES

Monday September 30, 10 am - 3 pm



Objective: Using card and paper, create your own 3D sculpture collage insect.

Activities:
Introduction to 3D paper sculpture techniques.

Learn 3D techniques such as folding, cutting, layering and gluing.

Students will be encouraged to experiment with different patterns, shapes and personalisation of their insect design.



MINI GALLERY/THEATRE DESIGN

Thursday October 3, 10 am - 3 pm

Objective: Create a mini gallery with your own exhibition. As gallery curators, students will design the theme of their exhibition and the style of the artworks to include inside their mini gallery (or theatre set for a play).

Activities:
Learn about the role of a gallery curator and the process of designing an exhibition (or set)

Discover examples of different gallery themes and styles of artworks (or kinds of plays).

Students will create miniature artworks using materials like modelling clay, acrylic paint and other mixed media (or theatre sets and props).
