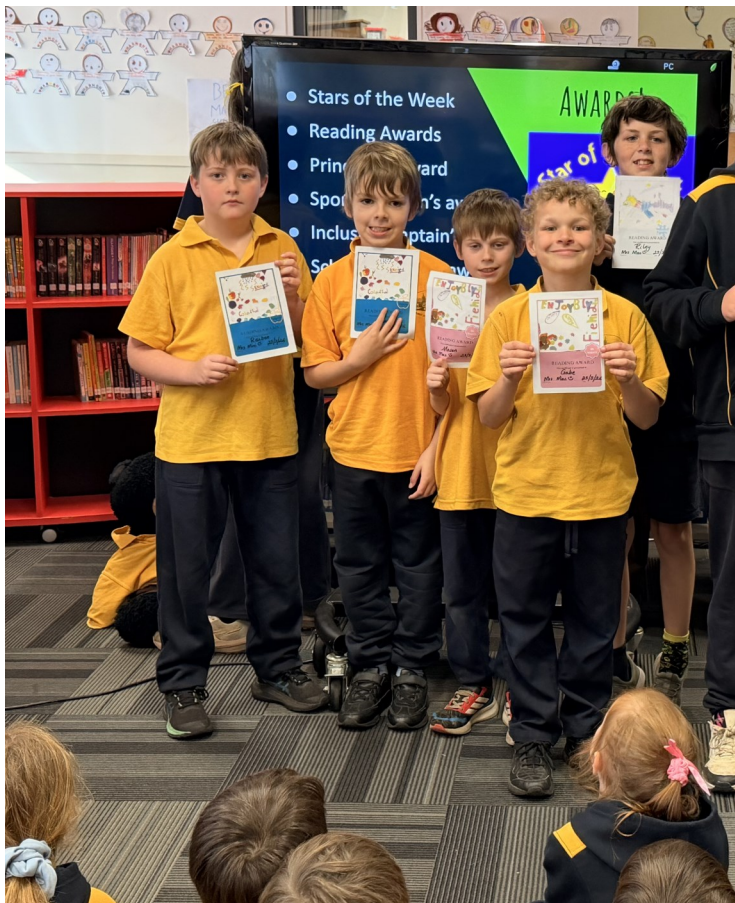
How do you make a tessellating pattern? Our 3-6 students are masters at it! Look at the fabulous tessellations made with all things nature!

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

Talbot Primary School is a proud Respectful Relationships school.

Respectful relationships education is part of the Victorian Curriculum and delivered by all Victorian government schools. It supports students to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed for respectful relationships, and helps to build respect and equality across the entire school community.

Research tells us that providing respectful relationships education at school can lead to positive impacts on students' academic outcomes, their mental health, classroom behaviour and relationships.

Our school uses the Department of Education's evidence-based teaching and learning resources to teach our students about Respectful Relationships from Foundation to Grade 6.

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships resources have 8 topics that teach students about emotional literacy, personal and cultural strengths, resilience, problem-solving, stress-management, help-seeking, gender norms and stereotypes and positive gender relations.

This fortnight in class we are working on Topic 3 which helps students to learn about Positive Coping. The activities from this topic are below.

CULTURAL OBSERVANCE AROUND THE WORLD

May 27-Jun 3 ~ Reconciliation Week - Celebrates and builds on the respectful relationships shared by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and other Australians.

June 3 ~ Mabo Day - The High Court delivered the decision providing legal recognition that Indigenous people have a special relationship with the land.

June 14-20 ~ Refugee Week - a time to acknowledge the success of refugees and humanitarian entrants in Australian society

June 17 ~ Islamic New Year - Observed on the first day of Muharram (the first month of the Islamic Calendar). This is the second holiest month after Ramadan.

June 19 ~ Dragon Boat Festival - Commemorates the death of the Chinese poet Qu Yuan. Cultural events involve eating rice dumplings and traditional dragon boat racing.

June 19 ~ Dano Festival - Official holiday in both South and North Korea celebrating the ending of spring as the summer season is welcomed.

June 20 ~ World Refugee Day - This day honours refugees and celebrated the strength and courage of people forced to flee their home country to escape conflict or persecution.

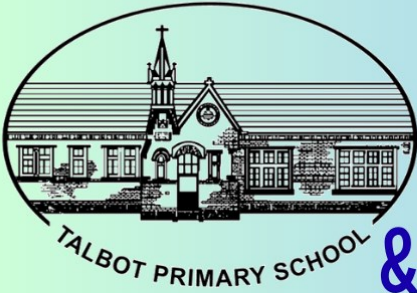
June 26 ~ Ashura - This day, for Sunni Muslims, marks Noah's departure from the ark and the exodus of Moses from Egypt.

July 1 ~ Coming of the Light Festival - Commemorating the arrival of the London Missionary Society on Erub Island in the Torres Strait in 1871.
